Additions to the agenda were: Newsletter, Roof, Smith Acres, Toburen Dog Case, Lagoons, Census.

Violations were discussed. Mike Burt called Ward and updated him on their progress. Trailers will need to be taken down in place because they are full and will fall apart if they try to move them. All of them should be down and removed by January 1^{st,} 2020. Carpenter's porch was mentioned. Adrianne and Dustin will get ahold of Carpenter's and ask them to clean it up.

Trish Mack discussed her plans to build a tiny house on a trailer at her property in the future. Council informed her she did not need a permit and it was fine for her to build one.

The 2018 audit results were discussed. No action taken.

The new roof was discussed. Duramax came and looked at the place where it appears it is still leaking. They corrected the areas. We will see if it worked when we get more moisture and see if the snow causes any more issues.

Land around the city area was discussed. No Action Taken.

The Toburen dog case was discussed. Both dogs were found through genetic testing to be predominantly pit bulls. Toburen's have 10 days to get the dogs out of town. Aaron Martin contacted the Toburen's attorney and informed him of the results. The owners of the dogs are aware of the results but will be contacted by their attorney's. If no action is taken by the Toburen's, the city will act.
