Before we know it, it will be time to do fall yard work and garden clean up. Some reminders: Please do not leave piles of limbs and debris laying on your property for extended periods of time. All yard waste needs to be hauled away immediately. The burn site is available to all Bennington residents to dispose of all these items including limbs, brush, trees, grass clippings, garden waste and leaves. Please remember to place items in correct areas and if your items are bagged, take your bags home with you. No trash is to be dumped at the burn site. There is absolutely no burning allowed of any yard waste, limbs, leaves or tree stumps in the city limits.

There are three cigarette butt receptacles in various places on the 1<sup>st</sup> block of Nelson Street. Please do not throw cigarette butts on the sidewalks, in the street, or in the flower beds in front of the city office for other people to clean up. Thank you.
