Jeff Scheele. We ask that everyone abides by this City Code,

Article 2. Streets

13-201. Streets Obstructing.

It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to obstruct any street, alley or sidewalk by placing any object, material or vehicle so as to prevent or interrupt traffic thereto unnecessarily.

Remove trailers parked or items placed in the alley right of way. Winter Ice Storms and before you know, Spring Storms can cause trees ,branches and brush to fall and damage cars, homes and properties and with power outages during these times, having the alley right of way clear helps crews to return power to our city in a timely manner.
