Regular Meeting
6/8/2026

Meeting was brought to order at 7:00 p.m. with a motion by Karl Serrien, second by Dustin Murk.
Motion Carried.

Additions to the agenda were: Street Dance, 410 N Nelson, Alley by Brian's shop. Pool chairs, Firework stands approvals, Shade at the splash pad.

Motion by Don Weiland, second by Karl Serrien to approve the printed list of bills and the minutes as written. Motion Carried.

Present at the meeting were: Brian Davidson, Jeff Scheele, Don Weiland, Dustin Murk and Karl Serrien. Mayor Ward Stockamp was absent. Also present were Adrienne Luthi and Mark Walker. Visitors were Sheriff Russell Thornton (left 7:23), Jim Plummer, Bob Boss (left at 7:45), Dennis Kelley (left at 7:45), and Bernie Regnier (left 7:50).

Council discussed golf carts, four wheelers, mowers etc. with Sheriff Russell Thornton. The council agreed that something needs to be done for the safety of everyone involved. Sheriff Thornton told the council they need to come up with rules and regulations and he would enforce it. Adrienne Luthi will ask other 3rd class cities to send their ordinances if they have them. Tabled until the next meeting.

The recycle center was discussed. The recycle committee will discuss the quote for separating the electric and if they would like to find something cheaper, they can discuss all of it and bring their findings and decision to the next meeting. Tabled.

Firework application approvals, set up, and firework display dates were discussed. Motion by Don Weiland, second by Jeff Scheele to approve firework applications for Bernie Regnier and Ward Stockamp to sell fireworks from July 1st through July 4th, and approval for the Firework display for Bernie Regnier to be held on July 4th, with alternate dates of the 2nd, 3rd, 5th, or 6th in case of bad weather. Also to block off North Street from Struble to Lincoln on whatever day the display happens whether on the preferred July 4th date or any other date depending on weather. Motion Carried.
